These wrought and cast iron gates originally stood in Station Street & were moved to their present position in 1997. Made for Bass Brewery in 1851, at Britannia Foundry, Horninglow Street, they had become obscured by shrubbery and in need of renovation. They are a distinctive reminder of the town's brewing heritage.
